This was my father's identification card from the National Maritime Union, issued in New Orleans on December 12, 1942. It states that his address at the time was No. 2 Agua St. in Ponce. Dad served as a Merchant Marine until 1966, when he retired early due to emphysema. As a ship's fireman, he had worked with coal and asbestos, plus he was a smoker.



My mother, Ana (López) García, had my sister take this picture of her on April 22, 1962 (her 16th wedding anniversary) so that she could send it to my Dad, who was navigating with the Merchant Marines.

At this time in our family history...

- Pedro José Rivera Maldonado was born on April 3, 1875. He was a brother of our family patriarch, "Papa Flor." Pedro only lived for 15 months, though, dying on July 10, 1876.
- 164 years ago, on April 13th, María Inés Vilá and Marcelino de la Cruz were married. They were my father's maternal greatgrandparents.
- On April 22, 1946, my parents (Oscar and Ana) were married in San Francisco.
- Florencio Rivera (Tío Guar) died on April 22, 1986.
- April 23rd makes eleven years since my father, Oscar Cruz García, passed away.
- Máximo Cruz, my father's maternal grandfather, married his second wife, Genara Maldonado, on May 5, 1909. He was widowed from his first wife, María Engracia García.
- Jesús Cruz Maldonado was born on May 20, 1896. He was my father's uncle, the son of Máximo Cruz and his second wife, Genara Maldonado.
- Elena Sevilla Rivera (Tío Guar's wife) would have been 92 years old on May 22nd.
- María de los Santos Cruz, youngest sister of María Engracia García was born on May 23, 1859.

A Page Out of Our Family History


I recently was surprised to receive a phone call from a man in Chicago by the name of Emilio Maldonado. He had made a trip to Puerto Rico, to his home town of Peñuelas, where he visited his cousin Virginia. Virginia took him to Ponce, to the homes of Luz, Lillian and René Rivera. There he saw the video of the 2005 Family Reunion and was shown copies of "¿…y la familia?" That's how he obtained my name and phone number. When we spoke, Emilio wasn't clear on how he was related to the people he had met in Ponce, nor who I was.

He told me that he was the son of Gilberto Cruz and the grandson of Máximo Cruz. Ah! Gilberto Cruz was a brother of my father's mother. That meant that Emilio and my father were first cousins. I asked him if he had known Oscar Cruz García. He said, "¿Oscar? ¡Claro que sí! Él visitaba a mi Tía Carmela, y yo lo llegué a visitar en su casa en Ponce." ("Oscar? Of course! He used to visit my aunt Carmela, and I visted him in his house in Ponce."). I told him that I was Oscar's daughter, and the cousins he had met were children of Oscar's brother, Guar, Ahh! Connection made! In the few minutes that we were able to talk on the phone, I got some important information to add to the Rivera Family History, and Emilio expressed interest in finding out more information about his ancestors. Of course, Emilio Maldonado is now on my mailing list, so here, for Emilio and for everyone else, is some information about Emilio's ancestors, taken from the Rivera Family History.

How are *you* related to Máximo Cruz? Well, you may not be. But if you are a descendent of Adela, Oscar, María, Elena, Guar, or Anita Rivera, then you are. The abovementioned were children of **Ana Cruz García** and grandchildren of Máximo. Other children of Máximo and his first wife, María Engracia García were **Alcisclo, Emiliano, Nicolasa, Eugenio, Brígida and Jesús**. Following the death of María Engracia on June 23, 1891, Máximo went on to have more children with Genara Maldonada, whom he married on May 5, 1909. These children were **Agripino, Jesús, Ángel, Carmela, and Gilberto**.

MOVE is on the Airwaves!!!!!!!!



LET'S PRESERVE OUR FAMILY'S HISTORY

Dear Family Members,

In the interest of preserving our family's rich history as it was captured on Super 8 film long ago, I am purchasing a rather expensive (\$725) high quality projector to use in converting the film to DVD. Unfortunately, the projector will not work with regular 8mm film, but if there is sufficient interest, I will investigate converting that film as well.

The old films will not last forever. They are already 30, 40 even 50 years old. Depending on how they have been stored, the film is becoming brittle. As with photographs, time affects the quality of color, thus deteriorating the picture. There are numerous professional companies that offer to convert your film to DVD. Some are better than others. The cost runs anywhere from \$8 to as high as \$20 or more for a 50' reel of film. It can end up costing you a lot of money!

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN SAVING YOUR OLD FILMS?

If you have Super 8 films that you would like to have preserved on DVD format, I am happy to do it for you. It is a lot of work, but it is for a worthwhile purpose. Additionally, with your permission, I would like to use edited clips from some of the films to produce one or more family history DVDs for everyone to enjoy.

If you send me your reels, I will convert them to DVD format, package the DVDs in a case complete with disk and case labels. It will look very professional, similar to what you buy in the store. I have professional software that gives me the ability to enhance the video. If the film needs to be color corrected, or improved contrast, etc., I will do my best to enhance it. All that I ask for in return is a donation of \$3.00 per 50' reel of film to help me with the cost of the projector and \$5.00 per DVD to help pay for the cost of the materials (disks, cases, insert and printing costs). If you are interested in preserving your films and your family's history, please send your Super 8 films to:

Do not send money with the film. I will contact you with an estimate based on the number of 50' reels you send me. If you have regular 8 mm films that you want preserved, do not mail them to me at this time. I cannot convert them yet. Simply tell me how many reels you have. I will investigate the best and cheapest way to get them converted.

WHAT ABOUT OLD PHOTOS?

Also as part of the project to preserve our family's history, I would be very happy if you send me your old photos (the older the better) so that I may digitize them. In return I will send them back to you along with a disk of your photos digitized. They will be viewable as a slide show on your computer or TV. I will enhance the photos as much as possible to improve them. I will do this for FREE because of the desire to create a central repository of photos representing our family's history.

If you send me photos, please label them. I know this is a lot of work for you, but it is important that we know who is in the picture. You can write on the back of the photo or use a Post-It note or number the photo and write the information down on a piece of paper. English or Spanish is acceptable. If you think I know the people, then it is not necessary to label the photo. Send your photos to the same address above.



If you wish to donate to this cause, I am pleased to accept your donation. You can do it online at www.ylafamilia.org/donate.php if you wish. The costs for doing the photos are not as great as it is with film, but I do have to purchase large hard drives for storage, create back up systems and catalog the disks. The data that is collected will be made available to all family members. As much as time, money and resources permit, I will try to make as many photos as possible available to you via the internet but it is too costly to upload all of them.

I hope you are as interested as I am in establishing a centralized "warehouse" of our family's history. I will try to do with film and photos what Norma has done for capturing the genealogy of our family and the wonderful stories as told by family members. This is only possible with your help.
