

At this time in our family history....


- On December 15th, 1852, María de Jesús García was born. She was a sister of my greatgrandmother María Engracia García.

The blessings I have shared with you, my daughters, are ...



Isidro Rivera Undergoes Knee Surgery

Uncle Isidro had knee replacement surgery on October 14, 2008 at Tanner Medical Center in Carrollton, GA. I asked Cousin Carlos to give me an update on his father's recuperation. This is the reply that Carlos sent:

"Dad was hospitalized for about 3 weeks following his knee surgery due to the need for rehabilitation. His stay in the hospital was not without incident, however. The day after his surgery, his wound must have opened somewhat and he bled without notice. It was sufficient that it required a blood transfusion. Then later, he fell twice, probably due to the drugged effect the pain medication was having on him. He lost his balance trying to get up to go to the bathroom. The first time he fell he was bruised. The second time, his head hit something which cut him and required stitches. *¡Pobrecito!*

He was never so happy as to be released and sent back home where he felt he could rest better without the nighttime interuptions to take temperature and what have you. Nurses visit him at home several times a week to continue his physical therapy.

Unfortunately, dad also reported that he has now strained his other leg (probably due to favoring his repaired knee) and that is causing some additional pain. He remarked to me that if he knew back then what he knows now, he probably wouldn't have had the surgery. He says he is having more discomfort and pain than before the surgery and he is really discouraged!

I feel sorry for dad and wish I lived closer to visit him often. But, I am certain that once he gets through the rehabilitation period, I can just imagine it's going to be significantly better for him. I certainly hope so."
