In that same issue, the "Meet Your Relatives" article was written by Diana about her son, Robert Junior, who passed away at the age of 20 on May 29, 2007. Her daughter, Daisha Caristo, was the relative you "met" in the Oct/Nov '10 issue of "¿...y la familia?

There are already a lot of pictures of me in this issue, but since my birthday is coming up, I couldn't resist this photo of me on my birthday 40 years ago! I look the same, huh? ©

The girl next to me is Laurie Jimenez, daughter of Sasha Lovelace and granddaughter of Elena De Nardo. Laurie was celebrating her 12th birthday. This picture was taken on June 20, 1971. I was home for the summer after finishing my first year at the University of Puerto Rico.

On the wall behind us is a picture of my dad when he was first in the Merchant Marines. It's a rare portrait of him in a beard.

Here is a picture of Joi from January of 1970. What a cutie! I love the hair. I believe that is her doggie, Holly-Go-Lightly. This was probably taken in Boulder, Colorado.

At this time in our family history...

- On June 8, 1893, Petronila Pacheco was born. She was a sister of Otilia (the mother of Nery, Isidro, Tita and Delia). Their other sister, Francisca, was born on June 11, 1887.
- Auntie Anita Merritt passed away on June 25, 1998 at the home of her daughter, Kathy Caffey in Nebraska. She had been suffering from emphysema for a number of years. Anita was the youngest child of the union of Florencio Rivera and Ana Cruz García, and was only a week old when her mother died.
- On July 3, 1861, my greatgrandparents, Manuel Alejo Rivera and Maria Apolinaria Maldonado were married.
- My beautiful and loving sister, Olga María (García) Smith, went home to Jesus on July 4, 2006, just three weeks before her 59th birthday. The family reunion in Carrollton just 10 days before her passing was a wonderful farewell party for her, and she really felt the family's love.
- Auntie Adele was born on July 22, 1909 in Peñuelas, Puerto Rico. She was the oldest daughter of the union of Florencio Rivera and Ana Cruz García. She was not quite seven years old when her mother died a week after giving birth to baby Anita.
- Florencio Rivera ("Papa Flor") —our patriarch died on July 22, 1941.
- My mother, Ana María López Maldonado, was born in Adjuntas, Puerto Rico, on July 26, 1911. She was the daughter of Juan López and María de los Santos Maldonado.

In Washington D.C. our group visited Arlington National Cemetery, where we heard President Obama give a Memorial Day speech. We also went to the Lincoln Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial, the Capitol Building, Mount Vernon, the Smithsonian Museums, and several other famous sites. We also went on a dinner-dance cruise. All this took place in only 2-1/2 days, then we traveled by chartered bus to New York.

She called to say they were running late and I was afraid that we wouldn't get to meet. I was so sad and anxious about that! But God is good, and as we were finishing our meal, Diana called again and said she was at the entrance. She said, "I see you!" and there she was with her phone to her ear, walking towards me with her husband and daughter. I didn't know

whether to laugh with joy or to cry! We had a lovely hour or so together, and then they walked me over to Rockefeller Plaza where I met the rest of my group

who had gone on ahead to visit "the top of the Rock". It was a short but sweet visit. I felt like I had done all the talking (I was nervous), but Diana later wrote on Facebook, "...I actually wanted to cry when I left you. I truly want to be around you more. I love your history that you shared with me. That is why I was not saying much..."




The Baby We Never Knew About

Just a few weeks ago I made a surprising discovery. My grandmother had a baby before Auntie Adele! The baby's name was Matilde, and she was born on January 27, 1907. She died on September 23, 1908, at almost 20 months of age. Why was this baby never mentioned? We all thought that Auntie Adele was the firstborn in that family. Perhaps because none of the other siblings ever saw Matilde (Auntie Adele was not born until July 22, 1909), they didn't remember hearing about her, or maybe they were never told that their mother had a baby that died before Adela was born.

Actually, Auntie Marie did once told me that her mother had had a baby before Adela, but she said it was a baby girl named Ángela or Angélica, and that the baby's father was not Florencio, but rather a man with the surname of Lugo. She told me that the child was raised by the Lugos, who were well-to-do landowners, and that she died young of tuberculosis. I have yet to find any documents supporting this, although I will keep looking!

As for Matilde, I am not sure if Florencio was the father because back then if a couple was not married the baby only received the mother's surname and only the names of the maternal grandparents appeared on the birth record. The father or the paternal grandparents were not mentioned unless he had "recognized" the child. For a genealogist, this is discouraging because one whole side of that behav's lineage remains a mystery.



In the Feb/Mar 2011 issue of "¿...y la familia?" I wrote about how my story, "A Slip of the Tongue" was published in Reminisce Extra magazine (Jan. 2011). In the March issue of that magazine, a reader wrote in to say, "Norma Pettit brought back memories with her story in the January issue's 'Short Memories' about the code phrase for 'Your slip is showing.' I'm a little older than she is, but we were also very modest in New York City and would never actually tell someone directly that we could see her slip. Our secret code was, "It's snowing down South."


