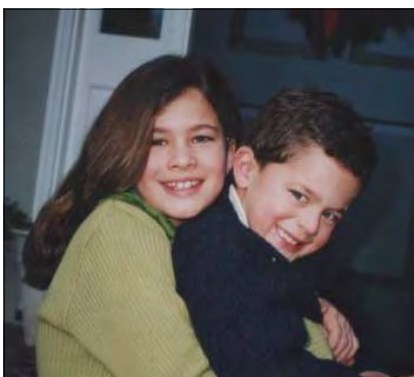

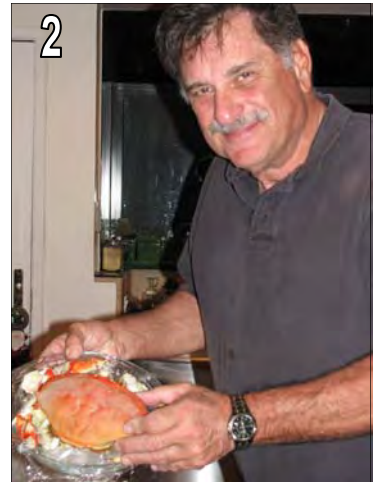


Joi's Christmas Visit *“¿...y la familia?”*

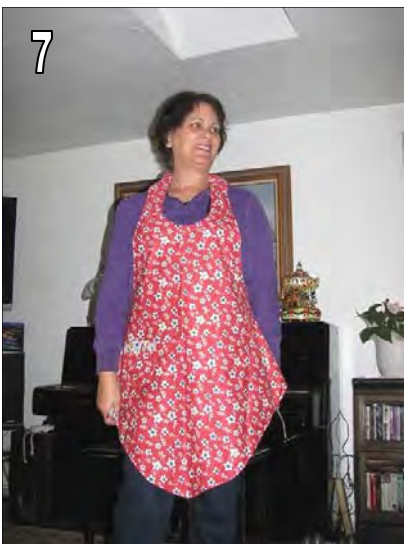
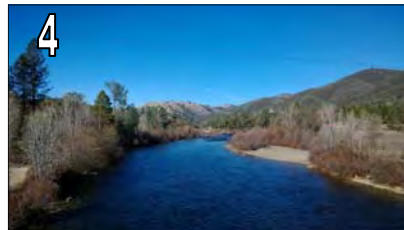


Do we look happy, or what? Joi's December visit truly kicks off the Christmas season for both of us.
