My Christmas present to myself last December was having my DNA analyzed through Ancestry DNA. The results were pretty interesting. Keep in mind that these are *my* results, and would also pertain to my full siblings, Olga and Ruben. If you were to get your DNA analyzed, your results could be radically different.

Estimates of my genetic ethnicity were created by comparing my DNA to the DNA of people who are native to a region. When they calculated the estimate for each ethnicity region, they ran forty separate analyses. Each of the forty analyses gave an independent estimate of my ethnicity and each one was done with randomly selected portions of my DNA. As I evaluate these results, the percentages from the Iberian Peninsula, Taíno and Africa are not surprising. What does pique my curiosity is the other small percentages from places like Scandinavia, Italy, Greece, Great Britain, European Jewish and Ireland. Then there was that 3% of Caucasus. What is that? I had to look it up: a mountain range between the Black and Caspian Seas that forms part of the traditional boundary between Europe and Asia. Okaaaay....so how did all those extra ethnicities get into the mix? I have a hunch from which of my tree lines most of this comes, but I'm not going to say anything until I research it and know more. Genealogy is a lot like archeology. The more you dig up, the more curiosity you have to find out more. There is no end to it, and that's where the intrique lies.

I think my mother, Ana Maria (Lopez) Garcia, was an amazing photographer, capturing candid, natural photos of her family without any formal training and using only a Brownie box camera without a flash. I believe my daughter, Ana Victoria, inherited this innate ability. At any rate, this is my favorite of all the childhood photos that I have. It shows us Garcia kids in the living room, photographed with only the natural light that spilled in through the large bay window. Our essence is here in black and white: Olga, the sweet big sister; Ruben, the impish middle child (all boy); and Norma, the baby of the family. I actually remember that pink, satin quilt that I am laying on. In fact, I think I still have it.

At This Time in Our Family History

- **April 3, 1875**—Pedro José Rivera Maldonado was born. He was a brother of our family patriarch, "Papa Flor." Pedro only lived for 15 months, though, dying on July 10, 1876.
- **April 9, 1912**—Auntie Marie, baptized as Maria Perfecta, was born in Barrio Santo Domingo of Peñuelas, Puerto Rico. She was one of Papa Flor's daughters and the matriarch of the Nicholson clan.
- April 13, 1839—María Inés Vílá married Marcelino de la Cruz. Her father, Pedro Vílá, was born in Cataluña, España. They were the grandparents of Papa Flor's wife, Ana Cruz García.
- **April 22, 1946**—Oscar Cruz García of Peñuelas, Puerto Rico, married Ana María López Maldonado of Adjuntas, Puerto Rico. They were married in San Francisco, CA, and were the parents of Olga, Ruben and Norma.
- *April* 22, 1986—Florencio Rivera ("Guar") died in Ponce, Puerto Rico.
- April 23, 1995—Oscar Cruz García died of emphysema in Ponce, Puerto Rico. He was 84.
- May 5, 1909—Máximo Cruz, father-in-law of Papa Flor, married his second wife, Genara Maldonado. He was widowed from his first wife, María Engracía García.
- May 22, 1914—Elena Sevilla was born. She was Tío Guar's wife, and the mother of René, Roberto, Raúl, Milagros, Lilliam, Reinaldo, Luz, Heriberto and Edwin.


